




Concept of Mechanization Service Center (CEMA)

The structure of CEMA consists in building a farmer autonomus entreprise for Financial et Technical Management to provide services for small scale farmers :

- Guarantee fund at National Bank of Agriculture (set up by SFSA), Fund permits the cooperative to take 200,000 USD to buy equipment
- Set up a small busness farmer service own by the cooperative
- Strong partnership with SAED and other partner for scalling up the model of CEMA (MOU)
- To implement paid services adapted to the need of producers




CEMA (UPG) is offering the following services :

- Preparing the soil: offsetage; ploughing; leveling; ridging
- Harvesting: harvesting; threshing
- **Storage** (1900 T): storage paddy producers; paddy storage reimbursed for benefits; seed storage
- Training and other services (fertilizer advise with RiceAdvice ICT tools, seeding...)




Services (ha) in 2016







Effets induits sur le travail du sol selon les producteurs

Learnings

- Access to Finance: Guarantee funds
 - facilitate access to credit for capital investment
 - increase loan volumes
- Management: Establishment of an independent enterprise with financial and administrative operating procedures
- Organization & Linkage to market:
 - joint planning with producer organizations
 - all year round servicing, demand-driven

- Replication of CEMA Model
- Setting up new services, tested by SFSA and Research
- Advocacy for the adoption of the CEMA model in national and regional policy development
- Transition from GIE to private company within Union
- Catalysing a market for equipment and maintenance provision
